Also in Montana is the **Kootenai**, situated on 42 acres, where owners just walk out the door and drop a line for fly-fishing. The historic property, once owned by the heads of the Anaconda Copper Co., includes the original Kootenai Lodge, now restored, a nature center, fitness center and barn.

Of the 42 homes, 10 are original to the property, and 32 are newly constructed with a 1910 feel. The freestanding homes are sold as condominiums, reflecting the community's plan to make ownership easy with extensive services provided to all owners. "We pick them up at the airport, and bring them back to the cabin where the fireplace is roaring and the kitchen is fully stocked," says Paul Milhous, the developer. The program includes endless activities for kids, a big attraction for John McMonigle, an Orange County, California, real estate executive who bought one of the new cabins. "With four active children, the focus is keeping them entertained," he says. "They can just go outside and run. Our family will be returning for generations to come."

The cabins are priced from \$2 million unfurnished to \$7 million fully furnished.
